ACW Henry House

The original Henry House was badly damaged during the first Battle of Bull Run in 1861. The building was later demolished and rebuilt. The rebuilt house is still standing however and is the one that will be familiar to wargamers and historians. This is the building represented by the model.

The model is a mixed media kit and includes a number of white metal parts.

This instruction sheet applies to TimeCast codes 31/001, 32/001 and 33/001.

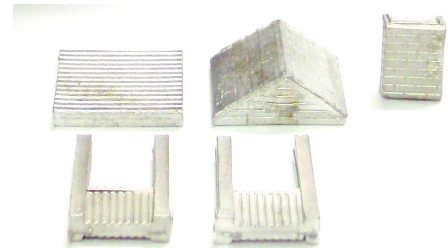
Assembly – Please read carefully before assembling the model

- We recommend the use of either a superglue gel or two-part epoxy adhesive (such as Araldite) for assembling the model.
- Check the fit of all parts before gluing them together. Some parts may require cleaning up before assembly.
- Any gaps between the parts can be filled with a modeling filler such as Milliput.
- We recommend the use of acrylic paints for painting the model.

Parts List

The model comprises the following parts:

- Main Building
- Chimney
- Porch Floor
- Porch Roof
- Porch Sides (2 pieces)



We recommend the following sequence for assembling the model:

- Glue the chimney into the slot provided in the roof
- Glue the base of the porch into position.
- Glue the sides of the porch into position.
- Glue the porch roof into position

Painting

The acrylic polymer parts can be painted without any need to prime or undercoat. Metal parts should be under coated before painting. We recommend the use of water-based acrylic paints and inks for painting TimeCast models.

Health and Safety Notice

- Parts made from Acrylic Polymer are non-toxic and safe to handle, however care should be taken when cutting or sanding to avoid breathing in any dust.
- Parts made from metal should be treated with care when cutting or sanding to avoid inhaling any dust (use of a dust mask is recommended) and any dust or fragments should be disposed of carefully.
- Do not smoke or eat while sanding or cleaning polymer or metal parts.
- TimeCast models are not toys. They are not appropriate for children under 36 months of age due to the presence of small parts.
